Medical costs in the United States are extremely high, so people without health insurance may not be able to afford medical treatment or prescription drugs. They are also less likely to get routine checkups and screenings, so if they do become ill they will not seek treatment until the condition is more advanced and therefore more difficult and costly to treat. Many small businesses are unable to offer health insurance to employees due to rising health insurance premiums.

There were 402 substantiated cases of child abuse or neglect in Mendocino County in 2014 – twice the state average according to Fort Bragg's Safe Passage and Laytonville's Healthy Start Family Resource Centers. We have updated Centers for Disease Control and Prevention indicators with the latest mortality data for 2011-2013! The indicators cover age-adjusted death rates due to various leading causes of death, such as diabetes, influenza and pneumonia, and motor vehicle traffic collisions. To see what we've updated, check out your <u>Community Dashboard</u> and look for the green "new" tags. through the umbilical cord. 
