Closing the language gap: a lifetime of possibility in 20 minutes

"The effect of income disparity on children is an increasingly widespread concern as more kids are poor today than even 10 years ago. The Southern Education Foundation recently released a report indicating that currently at least half of public school kids in 17 states are low-income, including California. Mendocino County is no exception. With 52.8% of children in Mendocino County eligible for free and reduced lunch (a reliable indicator of socioeconomic status) many children in Mendocino experience the effects of growing up with less. One of the most striking results of childhood poverty can be seen in language development . . . "
