Screening for Breast Cancer: Know Your Body, Know Your Risk

October is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Breast cancer is the most common cancer diagnosed in women around the globe, accounting for 25 percent of all cancers. In Mendocino County alone, researchers predict an estimated 75 new breast cancer cases and 15 breast cancer deaths each year. Mendocino County's breast cancer incidence rate for the most recent five-year measurement period is 121 women per 100,000 females, higher than half of California's 58 counties.

#### **Breast Cancer Incidence Rate**



Measurement Period: 2008-2012

This indicator shows the age-adjusted incidence rate for breast cancer in cases per 100,000 females. Breast cancer is a leading cause of cancer death among women in the United States. According to the American Cancer Society, about 1 in 8 women will develop breast cancer and about 1 in 36 women will die from breast cancer. Breast cancer is associated with increased age, hereditary factors, obesity, and alcohol use. Since 1990, breast cancer death rates have declined progressively due to advancements in treatment and detection.
