CELEBRATE!

- A growing alliance of community partners serves as a hub, not just for supporting Healthy Mendocino but also for joint projects to assess and improve local health. Some are described below.
- More than 13,000 people have visited HealthyMendocino.org to date, for more than 20,000 sessions.
- So far, the Healthy Mendocino Coordinator has trained 38 local organizations to use the website in their work. Trainings are always available.

LEARN

Community members and organizations tell us they are using HeathyMendocino.org to:

- Research data to create persuasive grant proposals, reports and advocacy materials
- Prepare for media interviews and speeches
- Strengthen local grant-seeking and grant-making by requiring Healthy Mendocino data in applications
- Set funding and program priorities based on local data
- Search the <u>Promising Practices</u> section for interventions that have worked in other communities
- Report on local programs and initiatives in website feature stories
- Publicize their events and activities in the Healthy Mendocino calendar

LOOK FORWARD

- A recent redesign makes the site easier to use and navigate. New features include the *Policy Corner* and special pages enabling community members to follow local initiatives.
- The new, collaborative Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) project is using data from HealthyMendocino.org plus surveys, focus groups, and other sources. Follow the CHNA project on the <u>site</u>.
- An initiative to learn about homelessness and explore possible solutions will publicize its activities and findings on HealthyMendocino.org.
- Our goals for the future include increasing community members' knowledge and use of the site; encouraging more local initiatives to use HealthyMendocino.org; and working with schools to engage students in using health data.
